A Constellation of Vital Phenomena

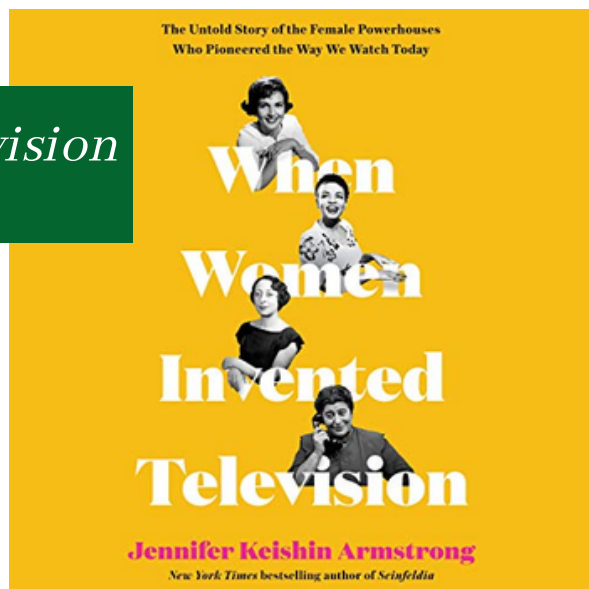

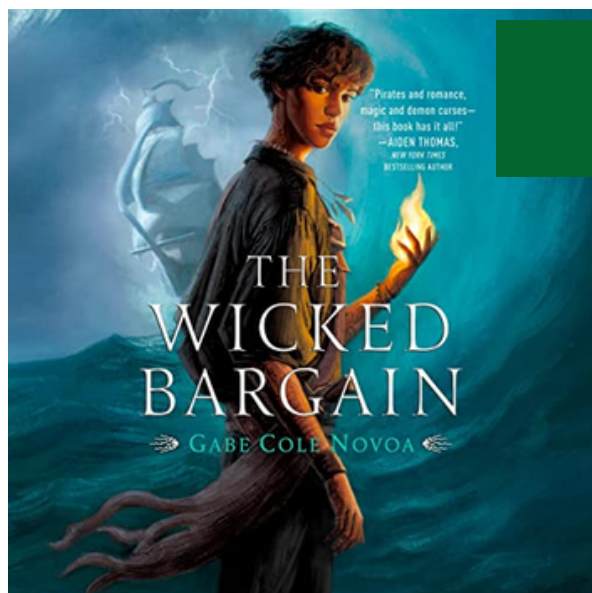
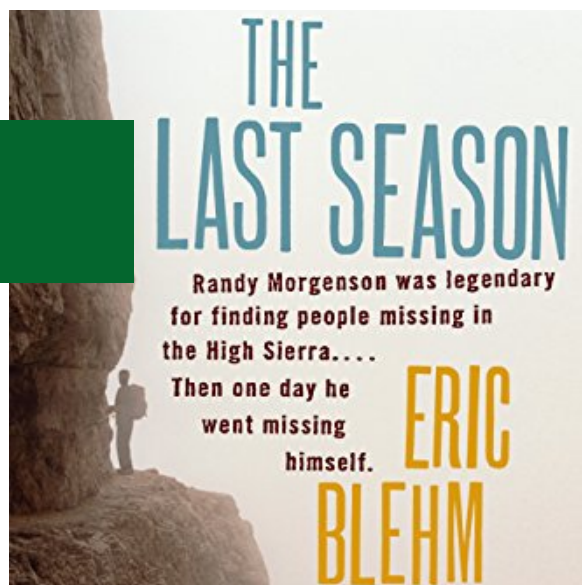
Beef

Eric Blehm

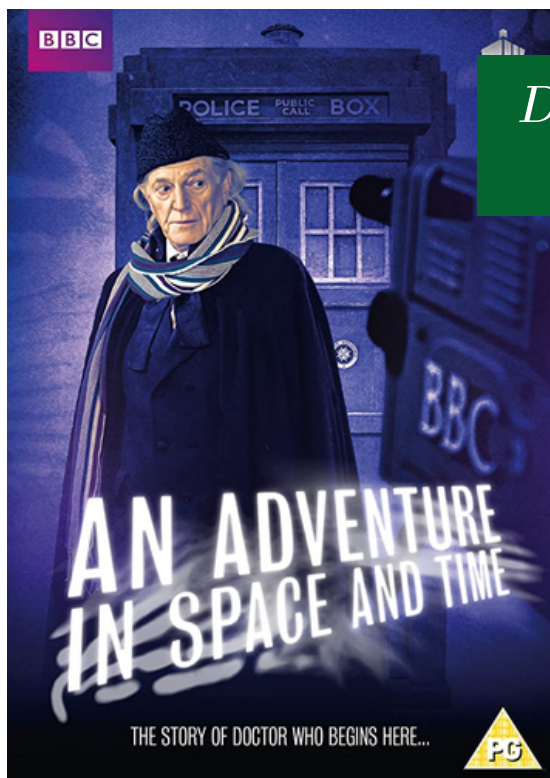

This is a fun little biopic about the creation of Doctor Who, David Bradley nails it as William Hartnell. You can find this on Hoopla.

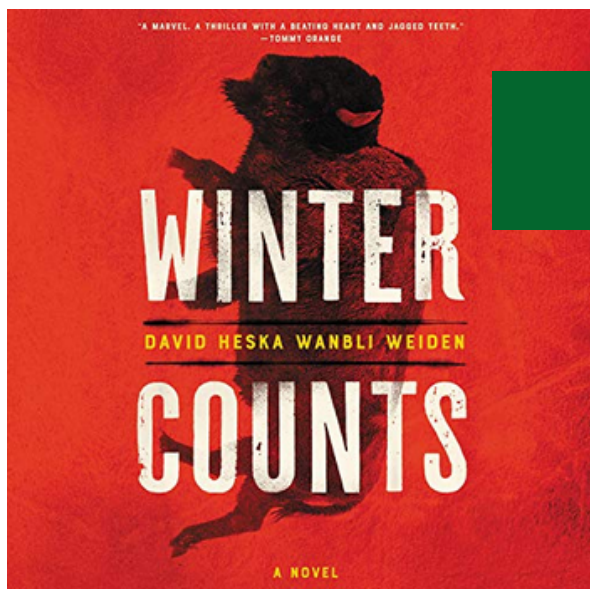

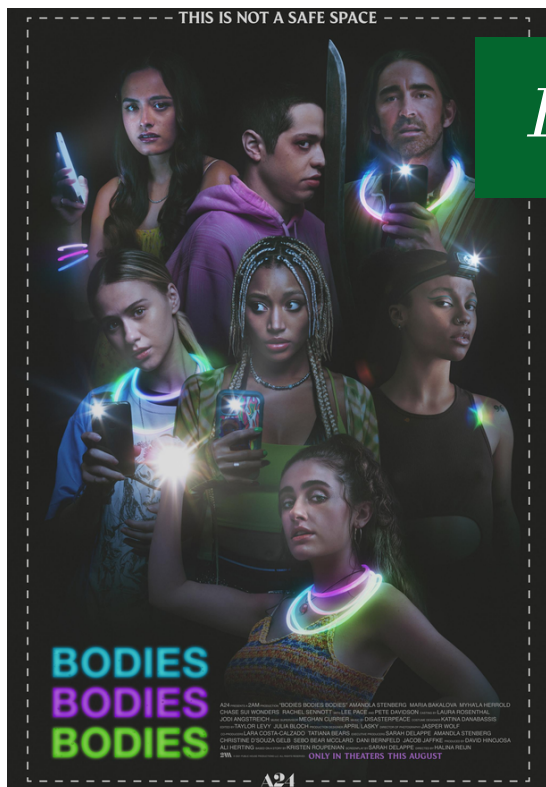
