She had been elected to the Library board right before I started as Director in 2015. During her time on the Library board, Maureen was instrumental in championing the creation of our MakerSpace. During the pandemic, she was a strong advocate for staff and

community. Through her many volunteer activities, including service on the DPS 109 Board, Maureen was motivated to help the entire Deerfield community move forward.

Since Maureen's untimely passing, I have been reflecting on the ideas of kindness, community, and volunteerism. In my eight years at DPL, I am often struck by the kindness of our community. People will send letters of support and thank you notes to the Library and have been known to deliver some delicious treats for our hard working staff to enjoy. Whenever we have a collection box in the lobby, whether it's for the Coats for Veterans or Toys for Tots, the community is very generous with their donations. That really warms my heart to see how engaged and charitable the community is.

The fall season can provide an opportunity to reset. It reminds me of new beginnings, mainly tied to a return to school in my youth, and now for my children. When you look ahead, if you have not done so before, I hope you consider adding a volunteer activity to your fall to-do list. I believe you will find it valuable and educational.




