


Book Recommendations







This simple board book is perfect for your youngest kids going to preschool! Get them excited to play, make art, read, and take naps with new friends.







Author/Illustrator Spotlight

JUANA MEDINA



Early Literacy Tips

Books often show us wonderful, heartful, silly, and amazing stories. They can take us to new places. But they also can mirror our lives and help us solve problems. You can use different stories to help your child work through various scenarios. Are they afraid of the first day of school? Do they worry about making friends? Did they have an argument and need help working it out? Reading a story and talking about how a character solves a problem can help your child handle a similar situation later. Ask us about a scenario, and we probably have a book for you!

We often highlight picture books in this newsletter, but non-fiction picture books are equally important to your preschooler!
Whether it's a book about friends all around the world, about how to be a friend, or how to apologize when the need arises, our non-fiction collection is filled with books that are perfect for this back-to-school time. Ask us for help finding the titles your child needs!
